



## Mr. George Henry Trail Jr

September 25, 1944 - June 29, 2025

George Henry Trail, 80, of Paragould, Arkansas, passed away suddenly on June 29, 2025. George was born September 25, 1944, to the late George Sr. and Jewel (Crosslin) Trail. Both his parents preceded him in death, along with one sister, Susan Bullard; two brothers: Charles Trail and Larry Trail; and a brother-in-law, Guy Gilley.

In 1974, George and Peggy went on a blind date; a year and a half later, they were married. This year George and Peggy would celebrate 50 years of marriage. Together they built a life rooted in faith and love. George described himself as bashful(!), but his family will always remember him as the best husband, father, and grandpa ever!

Family was at the heart of George's life. Meals were regularly shared around the dinner table, followed by Yahtzee games filled with laughter. He had a big heart and a true love for children and older adults. George was passionate about golf, which he found both challenging and relaxing. He cherished the camaraderie of his friends and time spent outside.

George had a special talent for fixing things which he often used to help others. As his friend and neighbor, Mr. Morris always said, "that George can do anything!" He had a photographic memory which served him well over the years. In 1997 when Samsonite (where he retired after 30 years) closed,

George was asked to reassemble Samsonite's huge industrial oven for Sunbeam in Paragould. Plans for the oven were lost in transit, and George put them back together by memory. The family, minus Jeremy who was in college, joined him in Arkansas.

A man of faith, George was an active member of both Griffin Global Methodist Church in Paragould where he taught Sunday school and attended Thursday morning prayer group and of Trinity United Methodist Church in Murfreesboro! He loved everyone at both churches.

George leaves behind his best friend and wife Peggy Trail of Paragould, AR, and five children whom he loved dearly: sons, Jeremy Trail (Leslie) of Murfreesboro, TN and Jonathan Trail (Jessica) of Paragould, AR; daughters, Stephanie Griggs (Jimmy) of Murfreesboro, TN; Tonya Walters (Thor) of Albuquerque, NM; and Julie Newman of Paragould, AR.
